DR. LAMB CHALLENGED MEMBERS TO ADVOCATE FOR THE DISTINCT VALUE OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY... DEFINE OUR PROFESSION AS MORE THAN JUST "HANDWRITING SPECIALIST". (2015)

IN 2017, DR. GRAJO FILLED A GAP IN OUR PROFESSION AND INTRODUCED A UNIVERSAL DEFINITION OF LITERACY AS AN OCCUPATION AND EXPLORED THE ROLE OF THE OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY IN LITERACY THROUGH A COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE.

LITERACY BEYOND JUST READING AND WRITING

 DR. LENIN GRAJO, PHD, OTR AND SHARON GUTMAN, PHD, OTR (COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY) ARE PROPOSING LINKING LITERACY WITH THE CONCEPT OF
 FUNCTIONAL COGNITION

• Functional Cognition: Thinking and processing skills to accomplish complex EVERYDAY ACTIVITIES SUCH AS HOME /FINANCIAL /MEDICATION MANAGEMENT, WORK, SCHOOL, VOLUNTEER ROLES, DRIVING AND COMMUNITY NAVIGATION (AOTA, 2016)



IS LITERACY AN OCCUPATION?

 MEANINGFUL EVERYDAY ACTIVITIES THAT PEOPLE DO AS INDIVIDUALS, IN FAMILIES AND WITH COMMUNITIES TO OCCUPY TIME AND BRING MEANING AND PURPOSE TO LIFE. OCCUPATIONS INCLUDE THINGS PEOPLE NEED TO, WANT TO AND ARE EXPECTED TO DO. (AOTA, 2014)

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY AND THE OCCUPATION OF LITERACY



- OT'S PROMOTE ENGAGEMENT IN READING AND WRITING
- OT'S ADAPT ENVIRONMENTS TO INCREASE LITERACY PARTICIPATION
- OT'S FOSTER SOCIAL CONNECTIONS AND EMOTIONAL REGULATION (COMPONENTS OF COMMUNICATION)
- OT'S ADDRESS VISUAL PERCEPTUAL AND FINE MOTOR DEVELOPMENT NEEDED FOR READING AND WRITING
- OT DEVELOP LIFE SKILLS TO BUILD HABITS, PATTERNS, AND ROUTINES INTO DAILY LIVING ... WRITING DOWN YOUR DAILY ACTIVITIES, READING CLOCKS AND CALANDERS TO MONITOR ACTIVITIES



AOTA HAS INTEGRATED SEVERAL SCHOLARS DEFINITIONS AND STATED HEALTH LITERACY AS...

...'INCLUDE INDIVIDUAL ABILITY, PROFESSIONAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS, AND THE CONTEXT OR ENVIRONMENT IN WHICH THE INFORMATION IS BEING DISSEMINATED (PLEASANT ET AL., 2016). WHEN ALL THREE ASPECTS ARE CONSIDERED, HEALTH LITERACY PROMOTES PARTICIPATION, EMPOWERMENT, AND CONTROL OVER DAILY LIFE (NUTBEAM, 2008; PLEASANT ET AL., 2016)"

FUNCTIONAL LITERACY INFORMATIONAL LITERACY

- COMPREHENSION, DECODING, VOCABULARY, COMPREHENSION, AND KNOWLEDGE UTILIZED TO COMPLETE A TASK WITHIN SOCIETY, THE MINIMAL LEVEL OF SKILLS NEEDED TO MEET PERSONAL AND SOCIAL SKILL IN ONE'S ENVIRONMENT (COMINGS, 2011)
- FUNCTIONAL LITERACY CORRELATE TO LABOR MARKET OUTCOMES




